March Monthly Meeting Demonstration— John Wilson

John is one of Australia's leading fine art oil painters, whose elegant pictures capture the elusive qualities of the landscape in a unique and gentle manner.

For John, growing up in the beautiful Blue Mountains of NSW instilled a deep love of the rugged grandeur, spectacular colours and the many moods they inspired.

Whilst always fascinated by paintings and artists, John did not pursue his interest in art with real seriousness until his mid twenties. He had been working as a professional musician and wandered into painting as a hobby. It was not long before he decided to devote himself completely to becoming an artist.

He is now an award winning artist who is recognized internationally, and is represented in public, corporate and private collections here in Australia and overseas. John's first exhibition was in 1979, and he has had 25 solo shows and exhibited with many other artists since then, including exhibitions in London, Japan and the United States.

He is a fellow of the Royal Art Society, a patron of the Society of Mountain Artists and his works have been reproduced in many books and articles.

RECENT ACTIVITIES Canberra Trip

The **Toulouse Lautrec** Exhibition was wonderful.. An amazing display of works many owned by Australian Galleries. The less often seen portraits were full of light and expression. It all showed the less fashionable side of French life at the time.

The Exhibition of important Australian Women in the Portrait Gallery was a diverse display of excellent paintings and photographs. The time line running through the exhibition was very informative and interesting.

Some of us explored the art installation at the front of the new extension to the gallery. *Within without* is a major new Skyspace by American artist **James Turrell**, one of his largest and most complex to date. Light is Turrell's medium, and his Skyspace is a viewing chamber that affects the way we perceive the sky. Commissioned by the National Gallery of Australia, Canberra, *Within without* is located in the Gallery's new Australian Garden on the south side of the building

You enter the work via a long sloping walkway. Inside is a large square-based pyramid with soft red ochre interior walls. A stupa made of Victorian basalt rises at the centre, highlighted by turquoise water. The stupa contains the viewing chamber—a simple domed space, open to the sky. A moonstone, set into the centre of the floor, echoes the oculus above.

Within the Skyspace, light seems more painterly. Movement and sound are intensified, the sky shimmers and pulsates. *Within without* is at its most dramatic and complex at dawn and dusk, marking the transition between night and day.

This would have to be a must see when visiting Canberra.

The only down side to the trip was the rubbish left in the bus by a few members. The volunteer driver should not have to clean up after dirty members.

MEMBER PROFILE DENNIS WEST

Dennis joined the Society of Mountain Artists in May 2003 after hearing about it when buying paints. He said he didn't know any members at that stage but was made very welcome at his first meeting. Dennis finds the friendliness of the SMA is it's greatest strength and he

has held more than one position on the Committee in order to foster the growth of the society. In his nine years membership he has seen it develop and grow in the process of offering various attractions to it's members.

Like many British immigrants, Dennis and Kath came to NSW following retirement because they had a son living here and after a tour of the Blue Mountains decided to find a home in this area.

Apart from his love of painting Dennis is also fond of gardening and discovered the climate in the mountains much kinder for this activity.

Coming from London Dennis enjoys painting all types of buildings from palaces to old tin sheds and also aircraft, an interest coming from his time with the Royall Air Force. For thirty years his living was as a Silversmith and for part of that time he had a silver antique shop in East Anglia.

Feeling like a complete change he became a London bus driver before returning to craft work and doing conservation work for the City of London which included restoration on charters for the City and conservation work for most of the liveried companies, also working for Rothschilds and Barings on their Art collections.

This interesting assortment of careers also included being retained by the Nat West Bank to maintain the Bank Museum. Dennis was part of a team that mounted small exhibitions for the City of London Corporation over a period of ten years.


Dennis produces some really excellent works in watercolour and pastels in which he is very competent. He enjoys running workshops too, finding the painting groups an opportunity to socialise as well as get more from our art

He says 'I am always willing to help anyone overcome an obstacle that is stopping them from enjoying their art'

Last year Dennis and his wife Kay achieved Permanent Australian Residency.

With such a generous attitude other members can always feel able to approach Dennis at meetings and talk about his techniques in pastel work, watercolour, ink and wash.

Maximum PERIMETER of Frames — ONE at 130" (330cm), plus FOUR at 100" (254cm)
Maximum PERIMETER of Unframed Painting — 75" (188cm)

Works should not have been previously exhibited with the SMA.

All works must be for sale. Prices not negotiable.

Please display your NAME, TITLE, MEDIUM and PRICE on the back of your paintings. Works delivered must be as per Entry Form. No substitutions will be accepted.

Artworks must be presented to a high standard:

For FRAMED works: Ready to hang, preferably with taut cord or wire and strong staples or "D" rings.

Or

- For STRETCHED UNFRAMED CANVASSES: No visible staples on sides, with all edges painted, also ready to
 hang with taut cord or wire and strong staples or "D" rings.
- UNFRAMED works: must be supported by a sturdy matt and covered in clear protective plastic. Unframed stretched
 canvasses do not qualify as unframed paintings.

All Works: No screw eyes or protrusions which can damage other exhibits. "D" rings and wire ends to be taped. No wet paintings, no infringement of copyright (e.g. other artists' work, photographs from calendars, Readers Digest and Australiana books etc.).

The SMA has the right to reject works. Exhibitors must arrange their own insurance. No responsibility can be taken by the SMA for damage or loss incurred.

Hand crafted ORIGINAL cards (maximum 20) - Limited to painting exhibitors only: Cards must be numbered clearly from 1 to 20, with artist's initials and price ON FRONT. All the same price. Whole dollars no cents. Please enclose an envelope with each card in a cellophane sleeve. No extra entry fee required for cards. Include details on the Entry Form.

Publicity: The Society may allow works on display to be reproduced by newspapers or TV during the exhibition period.

In order to exhibit, exhibiting members are required to assist in the various tasks in preparing and manning the exhibition. It is the exhibitors responsibility to obtain a substitute if unable to perform tasks or man the Exhibition at the nominated time. Non-exhibitors are always welcome to sign up for the roster.

Please indicate preferred times or tasks on the ROSTER included on the Entry Form.

Uncollected paintings will not be looked after. If artists do not ensure that someone else will pick up their paintings, they will NOT be taken home by a committee member, and the artist will be banned from exhibiting at the next exhibition.

'Tarella' is an 1890 weatherboard cottage containing family and Blue Mountains social history displays.

The Blue Mountains Historical Society was established in 1946 by the Blue Mountains County Council, later moving to Tarella. Hobby's Reach research centre and the historic cottage Tarella are two hidden treasures situated on the original road over the Blue Mountains constructed by William Cox in 1814. They are situated in one and a half hectares of gardens and grounds. Lieutenant Thomas Hobby constructed the straight section of road directly outside our premises and we recognise that fact by naming the research centre Hobby's Reach.
