Demonstration Report — Dennis West at the July meeting

Many of the members present at the July meeting would not have been aware that Dennis had to attend to an unexpected family emergency prior to his scheduled demonstration and we were uncertain whether he would make it.

Thankfully he did-THANK YOU Dennis- and we were all treated to an interesting and informative demonstration of pen/ink and watercolour wash. Dennis makes no secret of his interest in architectural subjects [and <u>you</u> thought it was planes and trains] and it showed in his choice of a Victorian era building at Sydney University.

Our video projection equipment really came into its own, allowing all to see not only him drawing and painting but also mixing and applying colour washes. Drawing in sepia ink, Dennis uses an old style pen nib/holder which gave the drawing a lovely air of spontaneity and variation in line which complemented the light washes of colour added later.

For added interest members were privileged to view a selection of his excellent sketchbooks filled with colourful plein air scenes. .

Julie Simmons—Demonstrator for the August Meeting

Born in western Sydney, Julie's early interest in art was fostered by her mother. She was constantly drawing on anything and everything with charcoal, pencil and cheap poster paint. Her first painting was exhibited when she was twelve, a pastel landscape, in a local western suburbs shopping centre show.

Her love of the visual arts was further encouraged in secondary school and every year she would attend the open day at East Sydney tech, the mecca for aspiring would be artists. Alas, reality struck when Julie had to get a real job! Fortunately that job was in an art studio in Sydney where she was taught all the basics of good drawing and the application of fresh and free washes. Julie worked in the studio for six years and in that time would produce work ranging from food to perfume to furniture. After leaving she continued to freelance for a number of years while raising her family. During this period she became enamoured with pottery and completed two diplomas at Penrith Tafe. Julie continued on this path for the next sixteen years, working from her studio at Castlereagh and building and firing a woodfired kiln.

In 2004 Julie attended a week long watercolour workshop in Bathurst and was instantly inspired to start painting. She went home and painted constantly. After three years Julie left work to paint fulltime and has found it a rewarding and exciting experience.

Julie works from her studio at Castlereagh and on painting trips around the country. She uses various mediums, predominantly watercolour but also paints in oils (always plein air), pastels and recently acrylics. Julie is also an exhibiting member of the Royal Art Society.

Congratulations to Marion Westmacott whose beautifully executed and presented botanical study of <u>Luculia</u> sp was selected by members at the July meeting as the worthy winner of the Jamison Award. Thanks to Marion for kindly donating this very desirable work which will become the raffle prize for our Spring exhibition in October. Coincidentally this botanical work will complement the 'Painting in the Gardens' exhibition showing at the same time.

Marion first began illustrating grasses while living on a property in the outback of the Northern Territory over 35 yrs ago and today is a renowned botanical artist ,teacher and natural history illustrator. She was formerly the Scientific Illustrator for the Botanic Gardens Trust and examples of her work are still available for purchase at the Garden shops.

Marion has deservedly won many major awards and is recognised worldwide particularly for her botanical and wildlife illustrations.

CHANGES TO SMA WEBSITE GALLERY PROCEDURES JULY 2013

Updated entry forms will be available at the August monthly meeting for financial SMA members currently exhibiting or wishing to display their works on our website.

Updates are due to some significant changes to Web Gallery sales procedures and charges set out below:

Charges:

Members will now be required to pay a joining fee of \$20 with each subsequent year incurring an admin charge of \$10 p.a.

Members will be required to advise the SMA upon the sale of any work displayed in the Web Gallery so that the painting can be removed from the site.

Upon receipt of payment for work, 10% of the value of the work (excluding any postage paid) to be remitted to the SMA.

Upon completion of sale transaction members will be invited to re-submit another work for display in the Web Gallery without further charge (other than annual charges as described above).

Procedures:

Rather than processing sales through the SMA web administration, the Web Gallery will show a **contact point** for each artist, whether an email address or phone number.

The artist will be required to conclude the sale with prospective purchaser and advise SMA as set out above.

Our new entry form will have provision for you to nominate your contact point and must be signed with your permission to display a **contact point.**

If you do not wish to have any contact information displayed on the website, the contact link will be set to the website administrator who will then contact you.

Artists Profile:

Artists will be requested to provide some information regarding themselves and/or paintings being displayed – no more than 300 words.

Photography:

Members who are not confident with photographing their work should contact any of the website committee who will offer some assistance wherever possible

SMA Exhibitions:

Approval has been given for artworks displayed on the Web Gallery to be exhibited in either the Spring or Autumn exhibitions providing they meet the other specified criteria such as 'must have been completed within the last 2 years', etc.
