

Each month the Website Sub-Committee undertakes the task of capturing a summary of

SMA website usage statistics to report to the membership through the Newsletter.

The Website Analytics picture for July 2017 was as follows:



There were **179** (158)* **Sessions overall**. Sessions are the number of times a user is actively engaged with our website. They may for example, be a visitor looking at the On-line Gallery or Events.

Traffic to our site was through the following devices: Desktop **78.2%** (65.8%)*, Mobile **27%** (22.8%)* or Tablet **6.7%** (11.4%)* over this period.

The SMA website had 119 (62)* New visitor sessions or 66.5% (57%)* of all users during June.

The visitor sessions included a total of **540** (478)* **Page Views**, some of which were repeated views of a single page.

The average number of pages viewed during each session was **3.03** which may have also included repeated views of a single page. The international average is > 2 page views.

The Average Session Duration i.e., the length of each session or time a visitor or user is engaged was **01.43** (02:48)* minutes.

Finally, the Bounce Rate which is where a visitor left the SMA site after landing on an entrance page but did not choose to interact with that page.

The bounce rate in April was **61.45%** (50.63%)* Generally speaking < 50% is what is acceptable internationally.

A Worthwhile reminder for our Members wishing to exhibit in our coming Exhibitions

Copyright laws for visual artists are pretty simple. . . so if you've been worried about your artwork being copied without your permission, or you're not exactly sure how to use the copyright symbol (©) next to your art, the following paragraphs should help.

First off, the moment an artist creates ANYTHING visual—paintings, drawings, photographs, sculptures, etc—the only person who is allowed to copy that art is the artist. If you decide to sell prints of one of your paintings, you can. If anyone else does, without your written permission, you have the right to take them to court and sue for damages.

In fact, copyright laws are so strong that an artist's family or legal heirs will still own the copyright to any artwork until 70 years after their death.

Artists that display their work online or allow their art to be published in books or magazines often put a copyright symbol (along with their name and the year the artwork was created) next to the reproduced image. **This practice isn't actually necessary**—they still own the copyright, even without using the symbol—but at least this will remind people not to copy your work.

Additionally, if you find out that someone HAS "infringed" on your copyright, and you can prove that the copyright symbol was next to the image of your artwork that they copied, you'll have a *very* strong case against them if the issue ever goes to court—which is exactly why so many artists choose to put up that copyright notice.

You should also be aware that even after selling an original work of art to a collector, The original artist still holds the copyright to it. The buyer cannot make prints or sell copies of your art unless you've given them that express permission in writing.

A artist cannot copy from ANYTHING visual—paintings, drawings, photographs, sculptures, etc. for exhibition, sale or reproduction.

Plein-Air Painting Exhibition 2017

Leura Garden Festival Sat 30th Sept to Sun 8th Oct

The Society has again been invited to participate with plein-air painting in the gardens during the Festival.

Conditions of Entry

- * Open to financial members of the Society of Mountain Artists
- * Paintings must be **substantively** done in the gardens **during** the Festival.
- * Paintings to depict garden scenes. Special features are allowed but no single flower blooms.
- * Maximum number of paintings three (3). Two will be hung, third depending on space.
- * Maximum outside (perimeter) dimensions of frame or canvas 330cm (130")
- * All works must be of high standard and be ready to hang,
- * Stretched unframed canvas must have no visible side staples.
- * All screw-heads, D-rings. staples, wire-joins must be covered.
- * All works must be for sale and prices are not negotiable.
- * Artist's name, painting title, garden name, medium and price must be clearly displayed on back of painting and must agree with information on entry form and title tag.
- * Painting Title Tags are supplied with entry form to be completed by the artist in BLACK BLOCK LETTERS and must be brought with paintings and entry form.

Delivery: To Leura Fairways on Friday 6th October by 12 noon at the very latest.

Entry Fee: \$5 per painting, payable on delivery.

Judging: Afternoon Friday 6th October

Official Opening and prize awards: 4.30 Friday 6th October at Leura Fairways.

Collection of paintings: Sunday 8th October between 4.00 and 4.30pm. No earlier or later.

All SMA Exhibitions are subject to 25% commission

TIPS

- * When visiting gardens please wear your name badge for identification.
- * Make sure your painting position **does not impede** the visiting public.
- * If painting in oil use an accelerant such as Liquin to help with drying time as no wet paintings will be accepted.
- * Suggestion Paint to size of an existing frame to enable you to fit new painting into the frame.
